Accommodation

Homestay

- · Single room, shared bathroom, full board
- · Twin/triple room available only for students travelling together (upon request)
- · Laundry facilities are available to the student at their homestay
- Linen and towels are provided by the homestay provider and are cleaned weekly
- Homestay providers are all located within a 60-minute bus/metro journey to school/city centre (average 45 minutes)
- Bedrooms and bathrooms will be cleaned once a week by the homestay provider

Residential accommodation

- · Only available for groups
- \cdot Standard twin rooms with shared bathrooms
- · Laundry is available free of charge at the residence
- Linen and towels are provided and changed weekly
- · Common spaces are available where students can socialise

Language programme

- Taught by friendly and professional English and French teachers
- \cdot 20 x 45-minute lessons per week morning
- · Placement test on day 1 to ensure students in appropriate level
- · Students will be placed in an international class with students of different nationalities
- Spacious classrooms
- \cdot Curriculum with emphasis on communication skills
- Course materials included as well as an end of course report and certificate



Homestay accommodation

The majority of our students stay in a local family to experience the true Canadian culture and way of life. Families are on average located 45 minutes away from school.

Residence accommodation

Students are staying at the Grey Nuns residence which is a student residence at Concordia University. It's a beautiful heritage building located in the heart of downtown Montreal.

Rooms include

- Bed
- Storage space
- Wireless Internet access
- If there is not a desk available in the bedroom, there will be a space provided in another room in the house for the student to study/work

Type of room

- Single room with shared bathroom
- Twin/triple room available only for students travelling together (upon request)

Meals

Meals will be served in the homestay. Meals can include:

Breakfast - Juice and/or milk, fruit, cereal and/or muffins, toast/bagels

Lunch - Packed lunch is provided by the homestay, consisting of Sandwich (e.g,sliced turkey, cheese, tomato and lettuce), fruit and vegetables (e.g,apple, orange, banana, carrot and celery sticks), juice box, snacks (e.g,pretzels, nuts, crackers)

Dinner - Evening meal with the homestay

Sample Menu

Pasta, salad, bread and cheese, dessert and/or fruit

Or

Roast chicken and potatoes, cooked vegetables, dessert and/ or fruit

Rooms include

- Single bed
- Wardrobe
- Desk and chair
- Wash basin
- Mini-fridge

Meals

Meals will be served in an on-site canteen at the residence. Meals can include:

Breakfast - French toast, pancakes or waffles (specific days) or toast, bagels, cereals, scrambled eggs, fruits, coffee and tea

Lunch - Packed lunch is provided and usually consists of sub sandwich with roast beef, turkey or grilled vegetables and a baked cookie, fruit and canned juice

Dinner - Tasty and wholesome dinners are provided, always a hot meal such as Italian spaghetti with a side salad and garlic bread and assorted desserts

Programme information

Arrival

Students will be met by an Embassy Summer representative holding a sign with the EC logo. For international flights, the EC representative will be standing outside the Immigration and Customs area. If arriving via a domestic flight, students will be met in the baggage claim area.

Welcome

Homestay students will be welcomed by their homestay on arrival. They receive a welcome letter containing course information, house routines, information about the family and how to commute to school. Homestay students will spend their first evening(s) with their homestay.

Activities

Activities are organised in between lessons and during evenings. These activities could be onsite, near the centre/school or around the city of Montreal. These may include:

- **Sports** such as soccer, rock climbing, volleyball, ice skating, jet boating and mini golf
- \cdot Cultural activities such as drama workshops, museum visits and science centre
- Evening activities such as Jazz festival, Shakespeare in the park and Underground city tour

Excursions

Full-day excursions from Montreal include:

Ottawa

Ottawa is the capital of Canada, and a very beautiful city to visit about two hours from Montreal.

On this trip, student will see Rideau Hall – a beautiful grounds and the official residence of the Governor-General of Canada. They will be able to see over 100 ceremonial trees planted by politicians and dignitaries from all around the world. After that, students will have a walking tour of Ottawa. They will visit the outside of the majestic Parliament buildings, The Rideau Canal, The Famous Ottawa Spider, and finally The Byward Market.

Mont-Tremblant:

Students get to explore this beautiful and charming city, located about 1.5 h from Montreal. The city has a great shopping, cute cafés and rich cultural heritage. It's located by a lake at the foot of the mountain Mont Tremblant, which is a famous ski resort in the winter time. There is a lot to do here such as hiking, cycling, canoeing and ziplining.

Quebec City

On this trip, students will see the beautiful Montmorency Falls and the romantic, historic City of Quebec. Montmorency Falls is the tallest waterfall in the province of Quebec. Students will be impressed by the grand expanses of nature that typifies Quebec.

Students will enjoy an hour-long walking tour of the upper and lower cities of Quebec. They will hear about the history of this city, and see the Murals, The Dufferin Terrasse, the famous cannonball, La Petite Champlain, The St-Lawrence River, and of course, the World-Famous Chateau Frontenac. Students will get to see history, beauty and culture all in one day!
